

Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme



If you are concerned your partner or former partner has been violent or abusive in the past, or you are concerned someone you know is at risk from their partner or former partner, you have a right to ask for more information from the police under the Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme, also known as Clare's Law.



In an emergency, is someone is in immediate danger, always call 999.

Payment in advance fraud

A payment in advance scam is when a criminal pretends to offer you something if you pay a fee upfront.

This could be for a loan, a prize, or even a job application. It's ok to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you. Contact your bank immediately if you think you've been scammed and report it to Action Fraud.



Make yourself heard

In danger, need the police, but can't speak?

- **Dial** 999
- 2 Listen to the questions from the 999 operator
- Respond by coughing or tapping the handset if you can
- If prompted, press 55
 This lets the 999 call operator know it's a genuine emergency and you'll be put through to the police.

The free Railway Guardian App is an all-inone safety app from BTP. It allows you to report crimes or concerns on the rail network, share your journeys with trusted contacts and get access to news, guides, or support.



Hare Coursing has started – please report

We have seen quite a few Hare Coursing incidents in the North of Hampshire in the past few days, this is likely to spread. Please continue to report all incidents of Hare Coursing.

If it is in progress - Call 999 quoting Op Galileo. Never approach these individuals, your safety is our priority. If it is safe to do so, please obtain any video or photo footage/Dash cam and provide as much information to the controller as you can on your report.



PROTECT YOUR BIKE

- Register your bike at www.BikeRegister.com
- Record your frame number and take a photo of your bike.
- Use locks that are approved to a Gold Standard by Sold Secure www.SoldSecure.com



As well as using a gold standard lock, it is wise to register your bike for free on the national cycle database <u>BikeRegister</u>. Also look out for **FREE** bike marking events being run by your local neighbourhood policing team, these are often advertised on the local team Facebook page.
