New campaign launched to tackle Vehicle-related anti-social behaviour in Hedge End district.

Hedge End Neighbourhood Policing Team Inspector, Alex Lockyer, said: “In terms of continued anti-social behaviour in the locality, it is clear that vehicle nuisance, racing motorcycles and illegal use of e-bikes and scooters are causing misery and concerns to residents, other road users and pedestrians.

“In response to the increased reports of this nature we are launching a new campaign to target this specific issue – Operation Tranquility.

“Operation Tranquility will involve officers within the Local Neighbourhood Policing Team working closely with our colleagues within the Roads Policing Unit to jointly tackle this problem.

“You can expect to see continued proactive patrols to disrupt this illegal activity and an increase in speed enforcement activity whilst we continue to work with our partners to

continue to identify long term solutions. "Please continue to report incidents to us, this directly informs our approach and where we will focus resourcing to tackle this issue and prevent further anti-social behaviour in our communities.
