

PROTECT YOUR BEACH HUT

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Here are a few DO's and DON'Ts to help you secure your beach hut

- Use good quality closed shackle padlocks which should be at least 6cm/2.5 inches wide, and use coach bolts instead of cross head screws for fixing. Any additional locks on the door should be positioned a third of the way down the door.
- Fix a solid steel security bar across the door. This should be bolted through the door and reinforced at the back (inside the hut) with a steel plate with matching aligned holes and use concealed screws or coach bolts.
- Security mark any property left inside, this can be done at www.immobilise.com which is a free service.
- Look out for each other. Keep an eye out on neighbouring huts and if you see any damage or problems contact your local District Council.
- Fix strong solid shutters over any glazed areas. These should be securely fixed and locked in place.
- Don't leave valuables inside. Take them away with you.
- Don't leave combustible or other flammable items inside, such as gas canisters. Same goes for matches or lighters.
- Don't leave materials left around the hut that could be used to damage yours or your neighbour's huts.
- Don't leave alcohol inside.
- You could consider fitting an alarm. Alarms are now available that can react to movement and when triggered can not only emit a loud sound but send an alert to your mobile phone.

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
